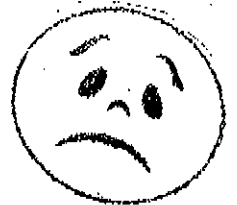
NEWS BRIEFS

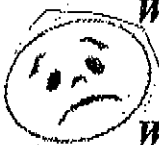

SECTION 7 OF THE IACT BY LAWS

***“At the first meeting after the Annual Meeting of Members, the BOARD SHALL elect a CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD. The CHAIRMAN of the Board SHALL PRESIDE AT ALL BOARD MEETINGS and SHALL HAVE THE AUTHORITY AND RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT ALL ORDERS AND RESOLUTIONS OF THE BOARD ARE CARRIED OUT.*”**

If the Chairman is absent, the Board may appoint one of its MEMBERS, present, as chairman pro tem.”

Roberts Rules refers to the presiding officer as “The President” but this is only acceptable when an Assembly is not incorporated and does not have By Laws. Indian Acres is incorporated and does have By Laws.



SITE CONTROL COMMITTEE IS UNDER NEW LEADERSHIP

Marilyn Prather selected the new Chair of the Site Control Committee. She takes over from the President, Chester Waters, who was asked by me, in September, to take charge for a few months, until the Site Control Department could be placed on solid footing.
