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### From the Desk of the Chair

In June of 2009, I sent a memorandum to the IACT Board of Directors stressing that it was our responsibility to do whatever is necessary to insure that the business of the corporation is carried out in accordance with IACT Governing Documents. This was before the election of a new Board in September of 2010. I also stated that we did not want to leave the next Board with no rules and no accountability.

In every society, laws are made to govern. When these laws are ignored and/or broken, anarchy sets in. Misinterpretation of these laws can also lead to unrest and turmoil among friends and neighbors. It's important that we learn what is in our Governing Documents so that you won't be misled or deceived. Very soon, in September 2010, you will be electing members for the IACT Board of Directors. There are some misconceptions about the process and the ways things are processed. I want to concentrate this time on the Nominating

Committee. Let me first say, that all of IACT Elections, in the past five (5) years or more, have been conducted by an outside Election Agency. Each year, a committee of the Board searches for agencies. Letters and bids to conduct IACT's Elections are requested. Once bids are in, the IACT Board of Directors votes on the agency to receive the job. In the last few years, Bowling Franklin & Co., LLP, located in Fredericksburg, Virginia have been awarded the contract.

Following the award, a Board Committee is appointed to go over the Nominating Procedures. According to the IACT By-Laws, the Board of Directors of the Association shall, no later than the regular March meeting of each year, appoint a Nominating Committee for the sole purpose of obtaining and processing nominations for election to membership on the Board of Directors and to make its recommendations for such membership. The committee will follow the established Nominating

Committee Procedures. This committee shall consist of five (5) members and as many alternates as deemed necessary by the Board of Directors (NONE of whom may be a DELINQUENT member), nor a member of the Board of Directors, with the exception of the SECRETARY of the Corporation.

The Nominating Committee shall publish in the weekly Bulletin, for four (4) consecutive weeks that they are now accepting applications for nominees for the Board of Directors. The Nominating Committee shall have discretion in establishing the methods and time for the submission of nominations and the assimilation form and distribution of information of the members of the Association of such nominations, it shall comply with the following procedures and times. The Chairman of the Board shall present copies of the Nominating Committee Procedures to the committee, which must be followed.

## Message from the President

I didn't come into this position as President of Indian Acres thinking that we would all think alike or serve as President alike. I have my style, they had theirs. Although I am handicapped, this should not have any bearing on whether or not I can do the job. Serving as President of IACT calls for respect, togetherness, long hours and the ability to make sound decisions. IACT is an Association that is governed by laws, rules and regulations. I intend to follow these laws, rules and regulations to the fullest.

Since taking office, I have had to sift through mounds of papers. There were no handing over notes, something I will do when I leave office. The staff has been very helpful and day by day, we are putting things in order.

Although we survived the snow of all times at Indian Acres, we yet have much to do to get this place ready for the Summer Camping Season. I have signed contracts to get the Pools ready for the 29<sup>th</sup> of May. We ran into a slight problem and that's the repaving of concrete around the Middle Pool. I have petitioned the Board for money from the Reserve Fund to take

care of the work. It's going to cost somewhere in the neighborhood of \$60,000.

We have just about completed the bathhouse in Glen 3. Because of the size of the bathhouse, we were not able to do all that we would have liked, such as additional toilets, showers and handicapped facilities. To do the job that's necessary, this bathhouse would have to be torn down and at the moment, this was not included in the first 5 years of the Reserve Study. We have a team that's going to be going over the second 5 years of the Reserve Study to, hopefully, bring it up to date to include things that were missed in the first 5 years. Meanwhile, the ladies in the Custodial Department have just about completed painting all of the bathhouses. They yet have a few more to go. They worked all winter to get this work done.

Presently, we are gearing up for our Annual Open House. Safford RV has placed several of the latest trailers at the Circle for Property Owners to view. They were gracious enough to let us advertise Indian Acres at the RV show without paying for a booth. We could use volunteers to show visitors around and work the tables in the Clubhouse. Check with the Adminis-

trative Office. You may also sign up by calling 540-582-6314.

I have scheduled April 10<sup>th</sup>, for our annual meeting with the Glen Chiefs and presidents and/or representatives of Clubs and Organizations within Indian Acres. This is an important meeting because it establishes assigned areas for the selling of food-stuff. The Flea Market is open on a first come basis. It's important that you attend or send a representative to the meeting if your Glen and/or Club plans to participate.

I am yet working on getting rid of old unclaimed trailers. It takes time. Remember, these trailers just didn't happen. It takes time to get titles and to remove from IACT property without some type of permission, whether it be from the owner, family member or county. Even the county is having problems clearing many of these trailers and lots for public auction. Have not been notified if and when the next tax auction has been scheduled. As soon as they notify me, I will let you know. It's been customary for IACT Presidents to hold Property Owners Forums on the Sunday following the monthly meeting of the IACT

Board of Directors. My first meeting will take place on Sunday following the May Meeting of the IACT Board in the IACT Clubhouse/Bar, 11:30am-12:30pm.

Signs will be posted in the Administrative Office and at the Clubhouse.

Please know that I am willing to work with all owners. It's going to take all of us to make Indian Acres what it can be. Most of all, we need peace and harmony among the membership. Come to the meetings, come to me for first hand information. Don't listen to second hand information. My office, in the Administrative Office, is always open.

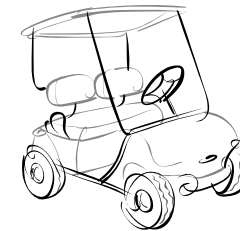
**FUN CART/DUNE BUGGY VIOLATION ASSESSMENTS:**

- 1<sup>st</sup> Offense-Written warning & parent/guardian and/or Property Owners notified
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense-\$10.00 parent/guardian and/or Property Owner notified
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Offense-\$25.00 plus loss of all rid-

ing privileges on IACT property for one (1) year  
 The above vehicles, dirt bikes and scooters MUST be inspected and registered with the IACT Security Department every year starting April 1<sup>st</sup>. Golf Carts only need to be registered one (1) time. Rules and inspection requirements for all vehicles are available at the IACT Security Office.

The committee shall accept nominations by petitions from eligible members other than nominations from the committee, and nominations from the floor up until 1 July of each year with the written signatures of thirty (30) different members of the Association eligible to vote at the time of signing and with a resume of not more than one hundred (100) words in length, but not less than fifty (50) words in length, of the nominee's background and qualifications. The committee will have no responsibility to accept nominations petitions filed after 1 July or which do not include the necessary signatures and resume and recent photograph. The committee shall present to the Board, no later than it's regular July meeting, a list of nominees, as they are to appear on the ballot, along with resumes and photographs. The list of nominees, as they are to appear on ballot, along with resumes and photographs are typed for the printers by IACT's Executive Secretary. Upon completion complying with the printer's deadline, packages are taken to the printers. Neither the President nor any other officer of the corporation should interfere with this package arriving to the printers at the approved deadline. It's the Chairman's responsibility to ensure that all of the Board's directions are followed. Last year, due to orders to hold packages past printing deadline, Cass Little, Chad Brown and the Chair delivered a sealed package to printers.

## Selling Your Lot...What You Should Know

As required by our Declaration of Restrictions 12.A, PRIOR TO THE SALE OF YOUR PROPERTY

Your prospective buyer(s) MUST apply for and be ACCEPTED for membership into IACT. Applications for membership are available from the administration office or may be downloaded from the website at [www.indianacres.org](http://www.indianacres.org).

The following guidelines were approved by the Board of Directors on October 23, 2004:

Previous IACT members who wish to purchase a lot

must apply for membership.

**Approved** applications for membership will be held for a MAXIMUM of ninety (90) days.

**Incomplete** applications will be held for a MAXIMUM of thirty (30) days. After which time the original application will be destroyed and a new application must be submitted.

Acceptable as photo ID with an Application for Membership are: State driver's license and/or state/city/military/government ID.

IACT's common areas, including the boat ramps/docks are for the use of all IACT owners and invited guest(s). Over the years, the boat ramps have not been properly identified therefore many owners have complained that they are not sure where the ramps begin thereby causing confusion. The ramps, which are part of IACT's common areas, are controlled solely by IACT's Site Control Department/Committee. The decision to identify and mark the ramps is final and irreversible. This is in accordance with IACT's Declaration of Restrictions under item 5. The department has begun this process of surveying all boat ramps and the department will have them marked and will eventually install split rail fencing bordering the ramps common area. According to the Declaration of Restrictions, all lots at IACT are subject to easement rights. The Site Control Department and or committee will be happy to discuss this matter further if you have any questions.

Due to the age of our electric wiring, IACT, does experience (on occasion) numerous underground wire breaks. Repairing these breaks are done as they occur.
