From the Desk of the Chair

By now you should have received a letter from PO River Water & Sewer Company. I encourage you not to take this letter lightly. It is going to be important to all of us that we respond as quickly as possible to this rate increase. As IACT Property Owners, we can ill afford an increase. Immediately, after I received my letter as an owner and as a customer of PO River Water & Sewer Company, I jumped into action.

By now, you should have received a letter from me, as an IACT owner & PO River customer, asking you to write a letter to the Division of Energy Regulation, State Corporation Commission, PO Box 1197 objecting

to the increase. There is also a petition objecting to the increase. We are asking that you sign this petition and get any other owner to sign and forward, along with your letter marked Attention: Lillian Copper-Wiggins, Glen 2 Lot 488, PO Box 120, Indian Acres Club of Thornburg 22565. Remember, only owners who are customers of PO River with bills in their name, are eligible to protest increase in water rates. Therefore, it is going to be very important that you send your letter protesting the rate increase in the name of whomever is paying the water bill. For example, if your bill is in the name of your husband, he has to sign the petition

and letter of protest, vice versa for the wife.

Approximately 16 years ago, we as Property Owners and customers of PO River Water & Sewer Company, had to mount a campaign against an increase in rates from PO River Water & Sewer Company. It took the collective efforts of all IACT Property Owners to reduce the amount requested, although they did get an increase; they did not get the amount they had requested. I find, this time, that the amounts requested are absolutely outrageous. We are only serviced water from late winter (November) to late March making a

Help us help you stop theft at the Acres. With over 800 acres to patrol and limited re-

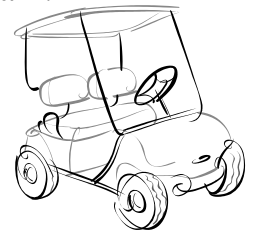

total of seven (7) full months, that we receive water. We don't have frost free pipes, therefore, most of our Comfort Stations are closed during winter months. On occasion, water in Po's water tanks are so low that customers have been asked not to water their roads or grass, including washing their cars. Water in our small Laundromat, on occasion, spits out rusty brown water which ruins white clothes and on occasion, in our trailers, runs very slowly. To add further misery to our water situation, when PO has to dig up for repairs, they don't put the ground back in order.

These are a few things that I've experienced. You may have experienced more. The most important order of business now is to get those letters out and petitions signed. Don't panic and don't become disgusted. This is not going to be a quick fix process. From experience, it is going to take some time to get this matter settled. We must come together in this issue. As soon as we retain the services of an attorney to represent IACT, I will be in touch. Finally, on December 23rd, the association received the letters regarding the rate increase. This matter will end up in the courts so be prepared for a long ride. You can contact me on 202-582-8239. Lillian Cooper-Wiggins.

Selling Your Lot...What You Should Know

As required by our Declaration of Restrictions 12.A, **PRIOR TO THE SALE OF YOUR PROPERTY**

Your prospective buyer(s) **MUST** apply for and be **ACCEPTED** for membership into IACT. Applications for membership are available from the Administration Office or may be downloaded from the website at www.indianacres.org.

The following guidelines were approved by the Board of Directors on October 23, 2004:

Previous IACT members who wish to purchase a lot

must apply for membership.

Approved applications for membership will be held for a **MAXIMUM** of ninety (90) days.

Incomplete applications will be held for a **MAXIMUM** of thirty (30) days. After which time the original application will be destroyed and a new application must be submitted.

Acceptable as photo ID with an Application for Membership are: State driver's license and/or state/city/military/government ID.

The Board of Supervisors voted on Tuesday January 12th to reinstate the fee schedule that was originally adopted in March 2008. Therefore, the 25% reduction in fees is no longer in effect for any permit application submitted on January 13th and later.

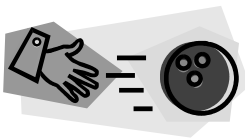

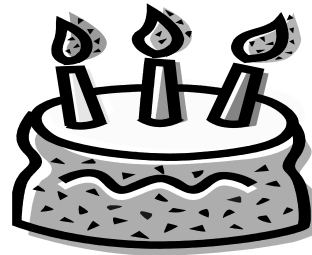
