Message from the President

We are making progress. It's been a tough job trying to get your Campground ready for the beginning of the Summer Camping Season. We have now separated the various tools, plumbing supplies and automotive supplies for easy access & accountability. Since getting our lawn equipment repaired, the grass cutters are full speed ahead. I am proud to say our Maintenance Department employees are doing quality work. I have hired two Maintenance employees who are well qualified in the Maintenance field. Just recently, the Maintenance Department replaced the roof on the Trapp Farm shed, rebuilt the lifeguard shelter and replaced the roof on the Security shed. Other improvements include: built wooden boxes around drains by the Basketball Court, built five flower bed boxes at the entrance to the Campground, painted all electric power and sewer boxes at the Caravan Circle, added sand to the horseshoe pits, installed nine culvert pipes, re-

placed wooden flower boxes in front of the Administrative Building, built a bench in front of the Trading Post, added sand at the Playgrounds, placed new boards on benches in front of the Clubhouse, put new carpet on the steps at the Pool, fixed three underground electric breaks and put down twenty-three tons of white sand over the Volleyball Court.

In the Administrative Office, the staff has been busy getting out the Board approved PO River Water Assessment for the Amenities and information pertaining to the Hearing.

I, as well as the staff, have worked diligently to meet all of our deadlines prior to the opening of the Summer Camping Season. The Pools have been prepared for opening on schedule.

This is my first year on the IACT Board of Directors, serving as President, however, not my first experience in management. As your President, I will follow the rules and insure during my tenure, IACT will

grow and all rules and regulations covered in our Governing Documents will be abided by. For your information, the Admissions Committee comes under the office of the President; Committee members are selected by the President. All requests to use IACT Amenities must come through the Admissions Committee. Request to use IACT Amenities must first be forwarded to the IACT Executive Secretary, Tina Garrison who after processing, will forward to the Admissions Committee.

Site Control is in the process of getting abandoned vehicles and trailers removed. Maintenance will also be starting to clean unsightly lots. This will be a slow procedure, but we are moving forward to clean up the Acres.

The Spotsylvania County Tax Auction is planned for Saturday, June 26th at the Spotsylvania Holbert Building. Our next Open House is scheduled for Saturday & Sunday, August 28th & 29th that will be a

From the Desk of the Chair

. Your President, Chad Brown has only been in office since September, but he has already acquired some capable help and has begun to make some solid changes, which has turned things around at your Campground. If you have talent and are willing to put your skills to work, it does not take a rocket scientist to figure out that you can make a difference. Even being handicapped shouldn't stop you from using the talents that God gave you. My grandmother use to say, "when you are afflicted on one side, God has a way of turning you around and giving you the ability to perform on the other side". Even though our President hasn't had the experience running a Campground, he has worked in the Module Home Building Business which reaching back on past experiences, has helped him as he

goes about making changes and improving the IACT Campground as a whole. This past winter storm caught us with our pants down. We didn't have adequate equipment nor experienced staff to keep up with the amount of snow and the fallen trees as a result of the heavy snow. Some didn't know how to operate certain equipment. As a result, several parts on several pieces of equipment was damaged and had to be taken to the shop for repairs. This delayed the snow removal process. I must say, your President didn't miss a day coming to the Campground. In fact, since assuming the position of President, he has been at the Acres 7 days out of a week. He realizes there's a lot to be done and what his responsibilities are as President to serve the funsteaders who elected him to the IACT Board of Directors. If you look around, he has gotten the Mainte-

nance Yard cleaned up, had the ditches on the black top roads cleaned, cut back the trees and out stretched branches, had grass cutters mow in front of various circles in the Glens and from the side of the roads and had several trailers pulled away. He's working actively with Site Control and IACT's lawyer to release claims on approximately 10 to 15 abandoned trailers. There's been, for some time, a back order from owners for culvert pipe. All but one or two request remain. What's more, he had the broken down benches in front of the Clubhouse repaired and has had the tree boxes rebuilt and flowers planted. I think you will like what you see. Check out the Message from the President in this issue of the Bulletin. The next meeting of the IACT Board of Directors is on the 26th of June in the Clubhouse begin-

ning at 9am. Don't forget the Candlelight Service at the Memorial Site on Saturday evening beginning at 7pm at Trapp Farm. Flowers are welcome. We will break bread together from 7:00pm until 7:30pm. If you bring flowers, baskets will be more appropriate as they will last longer especially during the hot sun that's damaging to plants not accustomed to extreme heat. Don't forget the Flea Market and Holiday Golf Cart Parade. Most Glens go all out for this Parade. It doesn't last long, but it's fun and the kids love it. Remember to register your Golf Carts, your ATV's and fun carts. I believe helmets are required, check with Security. Have a wonderful weekend.

1st Offense-Written warning & parent/guardian and/or Property Owners notified

2nd Offense-\$10.00 parent/guardian and/or Property Owner notified

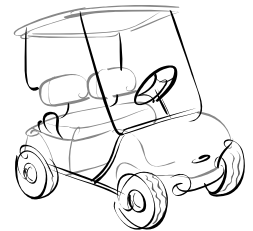
3rd Offense-\$25.00 plus loss of all rid-

ing privileges on IACT property for one (1) year

The above vehicles, dirt bikes and scooters MUST be inspected and registered with the IACT Security Department every year starting April 1st. Golf Carts only need to be registered one (1) time. Rules and inspection requirements for all vehicles are available at the IACT Security Office.

People Profile – OPERATIONS

IACT's Governing Documents-In accordance with the appropriate provisions of the Articles of Corporation of Indian Acres Club of Thornburg, Incorporated and those of Indian Acres International, Incorporated, the members of both Corporate Bodies adopted the By-Laws of the Association. SECTION 1 "Association" shall mean and refer to Indian Acres Club of Thornburg, Inc., a Virginia Non-Stock Corporation its successors or assigns. SECTION 11 "Board of Directors" shall mean the group of persons vested with the management of the affairs of the Association.

The Board shall also have the power to adopt By-Laws of the Association not inconsistent with the Articles of Incorporation or the Laws of the State of Virginia.

The Board is not an assembly. In an assembly, the President presides. In a Non-Stock Corporation, under its By-Laws, a Chairman is voted into office immediately following the Annual Meeting of Property Owners. The Chairman speaks for the Board and has the authority and responsibility to see that all "Orders" and "Resolutions" of the Board are carried out.

In well functioning Boards, the Chairman and the President work hand and hand together. The Association is made up in two parts, the Board, which manages the Corporation, and the President who is in charge of Operations. It's the Boards function to make policies and the President's job to carry out the policies.

Incorporated in Operations are the following:

Hiring and firing, Supervision of employees, responsible for upkeep and repairs of equipment, IACT amenities, buildings and grounds, Administrative supervision, salaries, Security, Restaurant & Bar, Trading Post, contract for service, building, maintenance and repairs to grounds. In general, the overall supervision of the IACT campground.

At the monthly Board Meetings of Directors, the President makes his report and informs the Board of problems and work that has to be done which requires expenditure of funds. It's up to the Board to approve expenditures from the Reserve Fund and various other line items for necessary projects.

A connected Board works well with its President. The Board, as a body, has a right to inquire about matters concerning Operations and set policies, but on an individual basis, Board Members have no right to interfere with the President in the performance of his duties as Chief of Operations.

The President is assisted either by an Administrator or in the present case, an Acting Administrator.

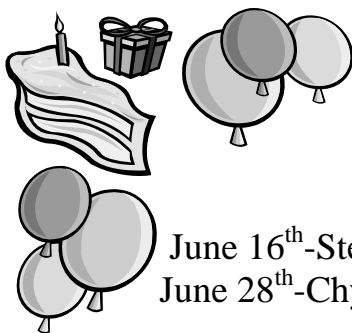
