From the Desk of the Chair

I would like to thank all of our Property Owners who took time to respond to my call regarding the PO River Water & Sewer rate increase. This is the most important issue the Board and the Association has to face at the moment. We are yet in need of owner participation. We need at least 1,000 letters and/or signatures of protest. At the moment, we are near the 600 mark. If you have not sent in your letter or signed a petition, please do so, as soon as time will permit. We will be in grave trouble if we are stuck with paying \$117,003.00 a quarter for water. At the moment, the lawyer dealing with our case has notified us that he has filed his second bill of particulars with the State Corporation Commission. He's waiting to hear from them. The case is expected to take some time. Meanwhile, the Board will meet to decide on a course of action, should we have to pay the increase until the case is settled at a hearing. I, along with Doris Ford, have been searching through old

records to acquaint ourselves on what we did at PO's last rate increase request (Doris was President of IACT then). The records indicate that we did have to do a small assessment. I do believe they will get a small increase, but nothing like they have requested in this newest rate increase request. I don't know whether or not you have noticed, but certain counties in Virginia have petitioned for an increase in water rates. I think it's important that I put to rest some of the rumors abound. No, Indian Acres won't go under. No, PO River will not take over Indian Acres. Indian Acres is financially solvent. What we do have to take care, of is to remember that there are those out there who would love to see us go under so that they can mount a takeover. However, I would not worry too much about that because, as I have always reminded you, if Indian Acres is ever taken over, it will be from within. The Board had a Workshop Session on Satur-

day, March 6th to discuss some important issues affecting Indian Acres and all of us as owners. This meeting was closed because we had to discuss personal, contractual and legal issues which, according to our governing documents, should be closed until decisions are made and contracts are signed so as not to compromise employees or any non-negotiated contracts. Further, the Board is not permitted to go into executive sessions during workshop gatherings. Those of you who know me are aware that I have always been for property owners rights, open sessions and the sharing of information to all owners. I have not changed. In our discussions concerning Po River it was learned, through looking over old documents, that the last PO River Rate Increase Request, lasted nearly 3 years. Hopefully this will not be the case this time. We have a very capable lawyer in

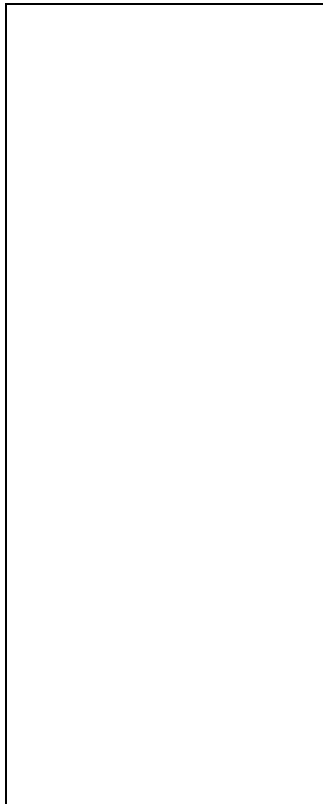
Message from the President

I can't tell you that things have been easy. Being new, as President of IACT, causes me have to weigh and sift through every document and past performance before some decisions can be made. The Association has numerous documents that have to be adhered to and any mistake in interpreting these documents, rules, regulations and By-Laws can cause consequences for Indian Acres.

Those of you who have come in contact with me, have been very patient and kind, and I appreciate this. Many voices can tell you what to do, but stops with the person designated to make the decision.

For example, this Winter Camping Season has been trying. Many decisions had to be made concerning how best to handle the tremendous snow blizzard and storm we had two weeks straight. Owners are entitled access to this campground during the winter and summer season. It's my responsibility to make it happen. We had several unfortunate situations, but we worked through them. In the near future, we are going to have to look at securing adequate equipment to deal with the amount of snow we

experienced this Winter Season. Causing the most trouble were the pine trees, which were drop-



ping all over the place. The ground was just too soggy to hold then. Then, there was the power outage. I will be making some recommendations to the Board for future snow plans. Meanwhile, we are full speed ahead with getting things ready for the Summer Camping Season. The ladies in Custodial have been working all winter painting the bathhouses and getting them ready for summer. Screens and other fixtures are being replaced in the bathhouses. Maintenance has been working on getting the #3 bathhouse ready for

the summer season. For the most part, all of the work has been done in-house. I've been keeping the Board up on what has been done and have secured the necessary fixtures to complete. It's been a team effort.

Conserving electricity and the reduction in cost of electricity by the electric company has decreased our bill drastically.

As required by our Declaration of Restrictions 12.A, PRIOR TO THE SALE OF YOUR PROPERTY

Your prospective buyer(s) MUST apply for and be ACCEPTED for membership into IACT. Applications for membership are available from the administration office or may be downloaded from the website at www.indianacres.org.

The following guidelines were approved by the Board of Directors on October 23, 2004:

Previous IACT members who wish to purchase a lot

must apply for membership.

Approved applications for membership will be held for a MAXIMUM of ninety (90) days.

Incomplete applications will be held for a MAXIMUM of thirty (30) days. After which time the original application will be destroyed and a new application must be submitted.

Acceptable as photo ID with an Application for Membership are: State driver's license and/or state/city/military/government ID.
