Message from the President

This week, my phone has been ringing off the hook. As President, I try my best to respond to all of your questions and supply you with answers to your concerns, however, should I not get back to you as quickly as you want, feel free to leave me a note or communicate with the Acting Administrator, Wanda Cushman. All of your concerns are important to me.

These past weeks I have been up to my neck working with my crew in the Maintenance Department to get this place cleaned up in time for the Open House on April 17th. As you are aware, we had two heavy snowstorms. The damage done was enormous and the Maintenance Crew is just beginning to see the light of day with all of the repairs and work remaining to be done. As Chief of Operations, the buck stops with me, as I am the responsible person

to see that the grounds, personnel and equipment functions. When things aren't done in a timely fashion, it's only natural that you look to me for answers, and this is the way it should be. Like the Board has its function, so does Operations. The President answers solely to the IACT Board of Directors, as a whole Association. It is my responsibility to hire and fire, to insure that IACT records are protected, to see that the grounds are maintained, that employees are working in a safe, drug free environment and to coordinate safety rules and regulations with all of our Departments. There are times when I have to make decisions that are unpopular with some. Since I have the responsibility for running this Campground, I have to make the decisions which I feel will best serve the Campground, it's funders and the Board

of Directors. At the moment, the most pressing decisions I am dealing with involves the Pools, the bathhouse in Glen 3, the preparations for the health department inspection of all IACT bathhouses, the leasing out of the Restaurant/Bar, cleaning up, repairing and replacing of such things as steps in front of Security and those in front of Custodial storage sheds in the Maintenance Yard. As you may recall, OSHA was called in for an inspection of the Maintenance Department, before I took over, and we were fined. It could have been worse. In case they do a follow up inspection, we are constantly working in the Maintenance Yard to make sure that the department is in complete compliance. There is yet much to be done. We are making great progress towards this goal. We don't want to

From the Desk of the Chair

On Saturday, April 24, 2010, the President, Chad Brown and I called for a meeting of Property Owners for an informational gathering to discuss the latest results as it relates to the PO River Water & Sewer Company Rate Increase. We felt it important to call for this meeting because certain actions were necessary, on the part of those who wish to testify at the Rate Hearing and those who would be testifying and submitting testimony on behalf of IACT, as owners. For those submitting testimony, there was a May deadline for submission even though the hearing is set for July 28, 2010. For this reason and in order to make sure all were on the same page, it was necessary to get owners together. To be unprepared at the hearing would most assuredly reflect negatively on Indian Acres. We never

want to enter a courtroom or a hearing unprepared. Further, we wanted to be sure that you had the latest information handed down to us by our attorney from the State Corporation Commission. Attorney Lion has asked for an additional 60 days from the May 1st rate increase date. According to the IACT By-Laws, page 9, Section 3 "Meeting of the Members may be called by the President of the Association". The Election Process- Last week I discussed the functions of the Nominating Committee. The criteria for being on the committee was spelled out as follows: in accordance with the IACT By-Laws, "This committee shall consist of five (5) members and as many alternates as deemed necessary by the Board of Directors (none of whom may be a delinquent member), not a MEMBER of the Board of Directors, with the exception of the Secretary of the Corporation".

The committee shall present to the Board of Directors, no later than its regular July meeting, a list of nominees as they are to appear on the ballot, along with resumes and photographs. The Board will then have the Administrative Staff, supervised by the Acting Administrator and President, type and prepare packages for the Election Agency to meet the present deadline by printer. The Board of Directors will submit the list of nominees, as they are to appear on the ballots, resumes and photographs to the outside agency to be printed and mailed to each eligible member no later than 25 days before the Annual Meeting and no later than 21 days prior to the last date the ballots must be received. Each ballot will include instructions concerning the voting rights of a member and the method to be used in casting his/her ballot.

All ballots shall be received by the outside agency. The agency shall certify the results of the election in writing on a date prior to the Annual Meeting of the Members. The agency representative attends the Annual Meeting of Property Owners, bringing with him/her election results in sealed boxes. At this time, the election results, in writing, is reported to the assembled body. The Election Committee, appointed by the Board, supervises and monitors all phases of the election process. This committee consists of five (5) electors and as many alternates as deemed necessary by the Board of Directors, none of whom are delinquent members or candidates in the election or members of the Board of Directors.

Captains Corner, News from Security

Vehicle Registration-Operation of Dune Buggy's, Go-Carts and Fun Carts on IACT property MUST be approved by the IACT Board of Directors, ANNUALLY. Unregistered Dune Buggy's, Go-Carts and Fun Carts will be stopped and ticketed.

FUN CART/DUNE BUGGY VIOLATION ASSESSMENTS:

1st Offense-Written warning & parent/guardian and/or Property Owners notified

2nd Offense-\$10.00 parent/guardian and/or Property Owner notified

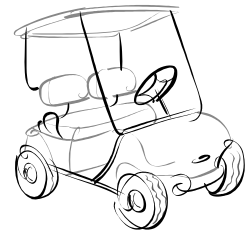
3rd Offense-\$25.00 plus loss of all rid-

ing privileges on IACT property for one (1) year

The above vehicles, dirt bikes and scooters MUST be inspected and registered with the IACT Security Department every year starting April 1st. Golf Carts only need to be registered one (1) time. Rules and inspection requirements for all vehicles are available at the IACT Security Office.

Unfortunately, there are some of you that paid for culvert pipe last Summer, but it was never installed by our Maintenance Department. I regret this and can only promise you that we will go full speed ahead when the supplies arrive.

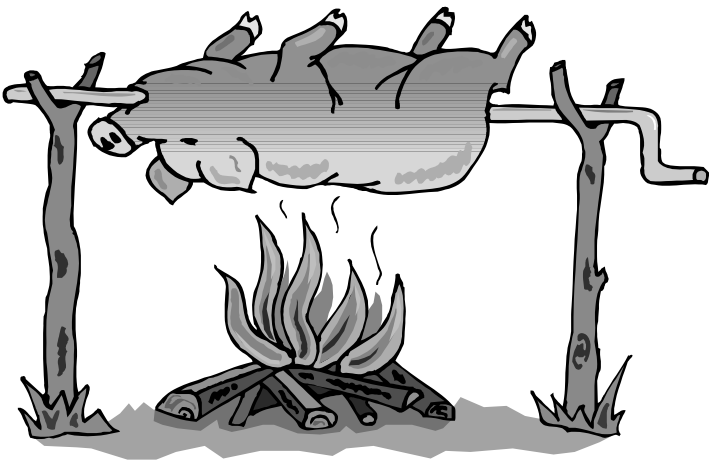

Neighborhood Watch has been around for many years. Today, it is one of the most popular and successful of all efforts to prevent residential crime. Here in Virginia, it is reported that several hundred thousand households are participating in local Neighborhood Watch Programs.

Although Indian Acres is not a residential neighborhood, as compared to those in our cities, its makeup is quite similar. We are situated as neighborhoods and we are as close as city families, in many instances, a bit closer, since we are in Glens separated by lots. We are more prone to crime such as theft because we do not live here. We come down for the most part on weekends, vacation during the summer and winter months. We have golf carts, bikes, trailers, sheds and screen houses that are easily broken into. Not like in the city, it is not profitable to place an alarm system in our trailers or in our sheds. Further, there is no system for answering such alarms. Our system is markings and registering of vehicles.

Primarily, our system is only as good as those who abide by IACT's Rules & Regulations. Our system is only as good as our immediate neighbors. Neighborhood Watch for many depends on neighbors looking after each other's property when they come down and reporting anything out of place when they return.

Security is our "Big Brother" as it relates to Neighborhood Watch. They look for suspicious characters, patrol, report open doors and broken windows. We in the Glens, as neighbors have to talk with each other about starting up a Neighborhood Watch Program that would best suit our purpose. We have to arrange meetings and volunteers for various watch duties in the Glens including the bathhouses. In our Glen 2 neighborhood, we have funsteaders who keep watchful eyes on the bathhouses, help keep them clean and supply them with various items to improve the looks and make sure the bathroom is user friendly and safe for our campers.

Some of the ways to better protect yourselves and property includes the following: Making sure that all exterior doors are solid core doors with deadbolt locks, doors should always be locked. Locks should also be changed after moving into a new/old trailer and that dusk to dawn lights are working and that shrubbery close to your trailer/sheds are trimmed from your building to prevent a break-in from taking place unnoticed.

A checklist for starting a Neighborhood Watch Program can be picked up from the IACT Security.

WHAT YOU EAT COULD HURT YOU

Rumors have it that the average American eats 100 to 150 hamburgers a year. Of course, hamburgers are not so bad; it's how you cook them and what you put on them. To cut down on the meat and fat content, it's recommended that we use 96% to 98% ground turkey meat. Over the past couple of years, there have been recalls on beef. We have also been cautioned to make sure that we cook the beef burgers well done. Then too, we have been cautioned that when grilling, summer months are prime months for grilling, that we cook with care. This means that we should monitor the amount of lighter fluid and charcoal used.

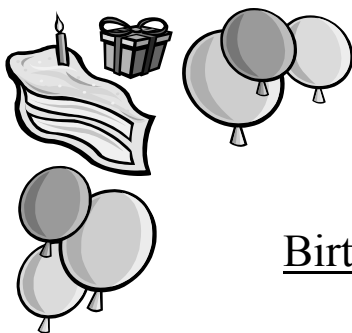
Preparing and cooking hamburgers for nutritional value: Combine 1-1/2 lbs ground chuck with scallions, peppers, diced onions, chilies and chili powder and chipotle in a bowl. Sprinkle a dash of salt or substitute and diced cloves them mix well together. Shape the mixture into 4 patties about 1/4 inches thick and 4 inches across. Place tin foil on grill (punch tiny fork holes in foil) and place burgers on grill. Cook over high heat for approximately 4 minutes. Flip for medium rare, cook about 4 minutes more for medium and for five minutes more for well done.

Transfer your hamburger on to a potato, wheat, pumpernickel bun or Jewish rye bread. Skip the cheese and eliminate 80 calories and 7 grams of fat per serving, if you used white bread/buns.

Total nutritional value of hamburger patty (approximately) 476 calories, 182 calories from fat; 20g total fat; 10g saturated fat; 182mg cholesterol; 407mg sodium; 10 carbohydrates; 60g protein; 25% daily calcium and 35% daily iron.

Ketchup, mustard, mayonnaise and other condiments can add to your calorie count. Worcestershire sauce, spicy tomatoes, garlic salt and other seasonings can add to your salt content (particularly worrisome for those who suffer from high blood pressure). High blood pressure triggers kidney disease and kidney disease causes high blood pressure. Diabetes is thrown into the mix somehow.

According to the JNC 7, if you have high blood pressure and kidney disease, the target pressure to shoot for is 130/80 or less.
