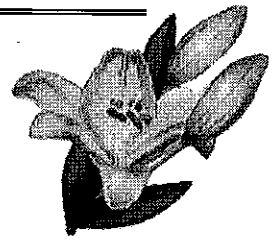

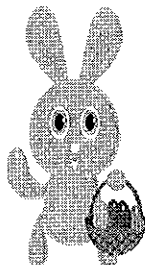

No Burning Before 4p.m.



The Virginia Department of Forestry would like to remind you that the Commonwealth's 4 p.m. Burning Law goes into effect Feb. 15, 2011 – the start of spring fire season in Virginia. This law prohibits burning before 4 p.m. each day (Feb. 15 – April 30) if the fire is in, or within 300 feet of woodland, brush land or fields containing dry grass or other flammable materials. Typically, during this period, fuels are drier and winds increase, making fires more difficult to control. A violation of this law is a Class 3 misdemeanor punishable by up to a \$500 fine. In addition to the criminal violation, those who allow a fire to escape are liable for the cost of suppressing the fire as well as any damage caused to others' property.

Vehicle Registrations begin April 1, 2011. Safety Rules & Regulations are available for all listed vehicles at the Security Office.

All ATV's, dirt bikes and fun carts must be registered annually. Golf carts are registered on a one-time basis. Vehicles are to be inspected and registered by the IACT Security Department, the cost is \$5.00. All golf carts must have a rear view mirror and working front and rear lights. All golf carts, ATV's, dirt bikes, fun carts and dune buggies must have the Glen & Lot numbers displayed on the front & back of the vehicle, **PRIOR TO REGISTRATION**. Numbers must be a minimum of 3 inches in height, per Board Resolution dated April 22, 2006.

The IACT Security Department will issue tickets to any Property Owner that does not adhere to the regulations. The fine will be \$25.00 for the first violation & \$50.00 for each additional violation. Registrations and inspections are done every day between 9am and 4pm.

NO REGISTRATIONS ON HOLIDAY WEEKENDS

UPDATE YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION-It is imperative that your contact information be current. The Security Department must be able to contact Property Owners anytime there is an incident on their lot. During the last snowstorm, numerous Property Owners had to be contacted by mail because their phone numbers and emergency contact numbers were invalid. Contacting by mail is a time consuming process and may result in more damage to your property due to the delay. The next time you are at the Acres, stop by the Administration Office or call 540-582-6314 to make sure your information is up to date and provide us your email address.

LOCK UP YOUR BELONGINGS-You have no idea how many times we in Security hear, "I was only gone for 15 minutes". An open shed door or trailer is irresistible to not only criminals, but also our furry woodland creatures.

GUEST PASS BOOKS: Please note that **ONLY YOU**, the **PROPERTY OWNER** are authorized to sign your assigned guest passes. Also all guest passes are to be written in ink.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH MEETING SATURDAY, APRIL 30, 2011 at 10am IAC CLUBHOUSE

Once again, the Spotsylvania Sheriff's Department Crime Prevention Officer has agreed to come to the Acres and speak to funsteaders concerning the Neighborhood Watch Program. NEIGHBORS HELPING NEIGHBORS

Neighbors Helping Neighbors Cleanup Campaign is a positive venture and all owners can participate. All efforts have been put forward by the President and his Maintenance Staff to wipe out as much of the blight as possible, prior to the beginning of the Summer Camping Season. We have some wonderful activities planned for the Memorial Day Weekend for adults as well as the children. With this in mind, we, the Board and the President are asking for as many of you that can participate. You can help by being a spotter identifying handicapped seniors who need help, identifying and reporting abandoned lots that need cleaning and reporting in to the President or the Acting Administrator. You can also help by making available, under your supervision, pickup trucks and golf carts to carry items to the Maintenance Yard. This is a time for all of us to pull together and work to uplift our Campground.

The Maintenance Yard will open at 8am on Saturday, April 9th and close at 4pm. There will be someone in the IACT Board Room from 9am to 1pm to serve you coffee, buns, water and to answer your questions and to guide you to where Neighbors will be working. If you can't join the neighborhood workers brigade, you can work in your own Glens and cleanup. Get together with your Glen Chiefs and make suggestions as to how you, as a Glen, can do your part in cleaning up the neighborhood.



COLLECTION OF LEAVES—If you collect leaves in bags, you must empty them when you drop off the leaves at the Maintenance Yard. There will be spotters and workers to guide you and show you where to deposit your leaves, trash and other debris. Propane tanks, gasoline cans, refrigerators, air conditioners, etc. must be brought to the attention of the workers in the Maintenance Yard. They cannot be deposited in with the rest of the trash.

Please remember to wear gloves, long pants that you can tuck into your socks and/or shoes.

Remember, for your enjoyment, the Clubhouse will be open Saturday nights B.Y.O.B. You may bring your drinks, chasers and snacks. As usual, we will have snacks and chasers at the Bar for sale. The ice in cups and bowls will be provided at no charge. You will however, have to pay to fill up your cooler.



FLOWERS NEEDED FOR BEAUTIFICATION

Traditionally, IACT Clubs & sanctioned Organizations have always contributed towards the beautification of Indian Acres. This is one of the reasons why, in the early eighties, when Charlotte Alderson was Chairperson of Beautification, the Board of Directors allowed Clubs & Organizations to have first choice for spots on the Caravan Circle to sell food and make money for their Glens & Organizations.

Charlotte Alderson and her volunteers kept the Acres looking beautiful. They planted all sorts of flowers and none was costly. IACT never had a budget for beautification. Ms. Alderson gave all she had working to beautify Indian Acres. Years ago when Lorraine Martin was President, she managed to get trees on Arbor Day, donated to Indian Acres. Though many of them are gone now, Indian Acres Property Owners planted back then, over 50 small trees (on the right side as you enter and proceed towards the Security Gate). Frank Glover had the Trading Post and he would donate all sorts of flowers, mulch and dirt. The love for Indian Acres was abundant and owners were proud of what they owned at Indian Acres.

Donating flowers for beautification is not mandatory. Giving to spruce up where you vacation and have fun just seems to give one a sense of pride. Glen Chiefs and owners in the Glens have always contributed toward beautification. Many owners have gardens and excess shrubbery at their home sites and they donate some of the excess to the Acres. Many are flower bugs who store bulbs and other nips from flowers over the winter at their home sites. Maybe you could share with us.

If you feel so inclined, we are asking for donations of flowers of any kind. No money will be accepted towards this effort. Donations of flowers of any kind may be left with the Recreation Directors or in the Board of Directors Meeting Room located in the Administrative Office on any Saturday. Just stop at the Front Office and ask for Marilyn Prather, Shirley Dorsey or Chad Brown. Planting will begin on Saturday, April 9th and continue on each Saturday thereafter as long as flowers and shrubbery are available.

As much as would like, there is nothing in the budget for flowers. For our beautification and Neighbors Helping Neighbors program, we are asking Property Owners, who can and who may have extra flower buds and seeds, to donate to our beautification program. We are in the process of contacting florists, flower yards and places like Lowes and Home Depot for donations of flowers and buds. In many cases because of weather, flowers that were in the yard, on the shelves when the weather was nice and suddenly hit by cold weather are in need of loving tender care. In most cases, these flowers are on sale cheap or are being discarded and/or returned to a vending flower house. IACT is a family with many voices and many opinions, but one thing we all can stand together for is IACT. Let's do what we can to get the areas surrounding the amenities, Security Gate, Front Entrance and Bathhouses beautified. Last year in Glen 2, others donated a blue spruce to plant on the side of Bathhouse 2. During the holiday season, this tree is decorated and it truly adds to the atmosphere in Glen 2. Flowers and trees are not political so whatever you can do to help beautify the Acres is greatly appreciated. All of the owners of property at Indian Acres will benefit through enjoyment.

TIPS FOR BETTER HEALTH YOUR BEST DEFENSE AGAINST HEART DISEASE

Your heart is a vital organ that keeps your body functioning. Unfortunately, many don't treat it that way. They may not realize that their lifestyle can endanger their heart. You can take care of your heart by making the following lifestyle changes:

BE SMOKE FREE-Smoking causes blood vessels to narrow. This makes it hard for blood to reach your heart muscle. Smoking can raise blood pressure and take oxygen from the heart. That's why smokers have twice the risk of having a heart attack than nonsmokers. If you smoke, it pays to quit. Also, stay away from second hand smoke. This comes from others smoking around you. Their smoke is bad for your heart too.



EAT HEART HEALTHY FRIENDLY FOODS-Eating fatty foods can lead to the building of fat deposits in your arteries. This can lead to blockage in the arteries of your heart and may lead to a heart attack. To help avoid a buildup in your arteries, limit foods that are high in animal fats. This includes fatty meats, whole milk, egg yolks and fried foods. If possible, choose low fat versions such as non-fat milk or low fat dairy products.

THE BEST TIME TO ♥LOVE♥ IS NOW

EDITOR'S NOTES....

Starting with the February Edition of the Bulletin, we started the Editor's Notes. This column is for the benefit of all IACT Property Owners, as we will cite various rules & regulations governing the Association taken from the Property Owners Association Act and other documents governing IACT, the Association. We happen to believe that "INFORMED OWNERS" are "SATISFIED OWNERS".

ARTICLE IV-COMMON AREA-By-Laws, Indian Acres Club of Thornburg-Page 4

Section 1 Members of the Association, who are not delinquent members, shall be entitled to the full use and enjoyment of the common area, services and amenities comprising same providing such use and enjoyment is consistent and in conformity with the rules & regulations of the Association published and in effect at the time as they relate to general usage or to a specific service or amenity.

Section 2 A delinquent member's right to the use and enjoyment of the facilities and services of the Association shall be suspended until such member has paid all outstanding annual charges and/or special assessments.

A delinquent member has only the right of direct ingress and egress only to his/her lot, to the absolute exclusion of the use and enjoyment of the facilities and services of the Association.

A delinquent member shall not be entitled to guest privileges nor shall a delinquent member be a guest of a member if the intent or effect in so doing shall be an evasion of these By-Laws or the rules & regulations of the Association.

NOTE: If you are a multiple lot owner and are delinquent on any of these lots your privileges to use the facilities will be suspended

Many multiple lot owners have the opinion that if they have more than one lot and pay on one, they are not delinquent. NOT SO! You are responsible to be financially current on all lots owned by you. To own a lot your name must be on the deed.

Owners of lots are responsible for their guest(s) and family members. Non-owners of lots can be asked to leave IACT premises for wrong doings and can be disbarred by the President for cause. It is important that owners explain the rules (do's and don'ts) to their guest(s) while visiting the campgrounds. Guest(s) should know that it is important that they keep their guest passes with them at all times while moving in and around the campground. This is especially important for the young people in case of sickness and/or accident.

NOTE: To make use of the common areas, you must apply to the Admissions Committee through the IACT Executive Secretary, Tina Garrison located in the Administrative Office. In addition, you will note in the IACT By-Laws that the amenities and common areas are owned by the Corporation/Association and that IACT Property Owners only own their respective lots. As members of the Association, owners are permitted use of the amenities, but must follow established rules and guidelines as set forth in IACT's Governing Documents.
