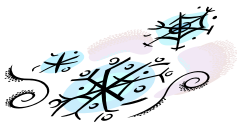

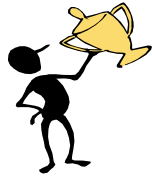

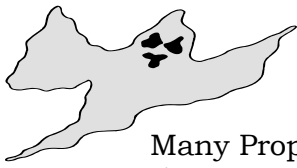
END OF YEAR TROPHY-GLEN 5

2010 ANNUAL MEETING OF PROPERTY OWNERS

The Annual Meeting of Property Owners was held on Saturday, September 25, 2010 in the IACT Clubhouse. The meeting was well attended with approximately 134 IACT Property Owners in attendance.

The highlight of the meeting was the election of Directors for the IACT Board of Directors. Candidates for the 2010 IACT Board of Directors included Michael J. Berry, Catherine Little, Kenyon Parker, Jr, Howard W.W. Thorn, III, Frances Underwood, Chester E. Waters and Lillian Cooper-Wiggins.

Bowling & Franklin Co., LLP conducted the 2010 IACT Election for Directors. The company used the printed labels and owners listing in good standing, supplied by IACT, to assemble the printed election documents in the mailing to each listed owner. This process was completed by August 13, 2010. On August 13, 2010, the election package was mailed to 1,982 owners as listed by IACT as owners in good standing.

The report prepared by Bowling Franklin & CO reflected the total ballots received including regular and write-in candidates. The report and the returned ballots were sealed separately and delivered on September 25, 2010 to the Election Committee at the Annual Meeting. Martin Holmes, Glen 6 was Chairman of the Election Committee.
