This includes improving on the strength and goals of the department. He says his department has a good working relationship with Spotsylvania Detectives and the Sheriff's Office.

No Burning Before 4p.m.



The Virginia Department of Forestry would like to remind you that the Commonwealth's 4 p.m. Burning Law goes into effect Feb. 15, 2011 – the start of spring fire season in Virginia. This law prohibits burning before 4 p.m. each day (Feb. 15 – April 30) if the fire is in, or within 300 feet of woodland, brush land or fields containing dry grass or other flammable materials. Typically, during this period, fuels are drier and winds increase, making fires more difficult to control. A violation of this law is a Class 3 misdemeanor punishable by up to a \$500 fine. In addition to the criminal violation, those who allow a fire to escape are liable for the cost of suppressing the fire as well as any damage caused to others' property.

Vehicle Registrations begin April 1, 2011. Safety Rules & Regulations are available for all listed vehicles at the Security Office.

All ATV's, dirt bikes and fun carts must be registered annually. Golf carts are registered on a one-time basis. Vehicles are to be inspected and registered by the IACT Security Department, the cost is \$5.00. All golf carts must have a rear view mirror and working front and rear lights if they are being used after dark. All golf carts, ATV's, dirt bikes, fun carts and dune buggies must have the Glen & Lot numbers displayed on the front &

back of the vehicle, **PRIOR TO REGISTRATION**. Numbers must be a minimum of 3 inches in height, per Board Resolution dated April 22, 2006.

The IACT Security Department will issue tickets to any Property Owner that does not adhere to the regulations. The fine will be \$25.00 for the first violation & \$50.00 for each additional violation. Registrations and inspections are done every day between 9am and 4pm. **NO REGISTRATIONS ON HOLIDAY WEEKENDS**

UPDATE YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION-It is imperative that your contact information be current. The Security Department must be able to contact Property Owners anytime there is an incident on their lot. During the last snowstorm, numerous Property Owners had to be contacted by mail because their phone numbers and emergency contact numbers were invalid. Contacting by mail is a time consuming process and may result in more damage to your property due to the delay. The next time you are at the Acres, stop by the Administration Office or call 540-582-6314 to make sure your information is up to date and provide us your email address.

LOCK UP YOUR BELONGINGS-You have no idea how many times we in Security hear, "I was only gone for 15 minutes". An open shed door or trailer is irresistible to not only criminals, but also our furry woodland creatures.

UNFORTUNATE FIRE IN GLEN 8

On February 14th, there was an unfortunate fire that occurred in Glen 8 that destroyed and damaged some properties. The Fire Marshall investigated the fire and the cause was electrical. Fortunately, there was no one on their property at the time.

The Fire Marshall prefers that during all seasons, appliances and/or outdoor string lights should be unplugged. He also stated that having a sensor light (dusk to dawn) would be much safer. Any animal could chew through any type of electrical wiring that could cause a fire to ignite.

Also, when burning leaves, make sure it is contained in a fire pit. Please **DO NOT** burn when there is high wind. **NEVER** leave a campfire unattended at **ANYTIME**.



NEIGHBORS HELPING NEIGHBORS

Neighbors Helping Neighbors will celebrate its 10th year of operation on April 9, 2011. This was the brainchild of the Chairman of the Board, Lillian Cooper-Wiggins. At that time, Victoria Hill, then member of the IACT Board of Directors was Vice Chairman. Melvin Streeter, who was then Vice President, was instrumental in recruiting Property Owners and getting the necessary services provided (dumpsters, service of Maintenance, locations for leaf disposal). Mr. Streeter rolled up his sleeves with the rest of the owners to clean and remove debris and trash for the Acres. Although not a member of the Board at that time, Shirley Dorsey, who is now IACT Corporate Secretary, recruited members of her Glen as her husband was and is, as of this writing, Glen Chief of 2. Donna Utz always operated the table at Trapp Farm and Brenda Baker, Glen 2 helped organize the day's activities. Hats off to those owners who helped organize Neighbors Helping Neighbors, but are no longer active at Indian Acres. Many own property, but due to health and other reasons, are no longer able to get to Indian Acres as often as they use to. Hurricane Isabel had a lot to do with Property Owners' participation when many lost their trailers to that destructive storm. Trees fell and sheds were demolished from winds and falling trees. Flooding waters destroyed many campsites.

Never the less, this tradition has continued with much success throughout the years.



There's much to be thankful for as volunteers are yet stepping up to the plate. The President's Office along with Administrative and Maintenance Departments are going full speed ahead to clean up Indian Acres.

The Site Control Department is sending out letters to owners with abandoned trailers and lending all of their help to Property Owners whose property has yet to be restored from the storm. Over the past year, these collaborative efforts have paid off. So far this year, the President and Site Control have managed to remove and destroy from the Acres (161) trailers, cars and a number of trashed golf carts.

FLOWERS NEEDED FOR BEAUTIFICATION

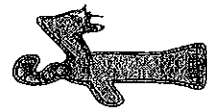

TIPS FOR BETTER HEALTH



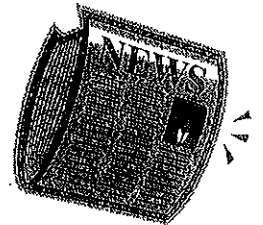

Healthy Food. The Apple-The soluble fiber in apples are what makes them such a great way to balance your blood sugar and lose weight. According to a Brazilian study, women who eat three (3) apples a day lose more weight and keep their blood sugar lower than women who don't. EDITOR'S NOTE

Starting with this edition of the Bulletin, for the benefit of all IACT Property Owners, we will cite various rules & regulations governing the Association taken from the Property Owners Association Act.

Adoption and Enforcement of Rules

The Board of Directors of the Association shall have the power to establish, adopt and enforce rules & regulations with respect to use of the Common Areas and with respect to such other areas of responsibility assigned to the Association by the declaration, except when expressly reserved by the declaration to the members.

Rules & regulations may be adopted by resolution and shall be reasonably published or distributed throughout the development. (see resolutions passed at the January 2011 Meeting of the IACT Board of Directors).

A majority of votes cast in person or by proxy at a meeting convened in accordance with the provisions of the Association's By-Laws and called for that purpose shall repeal or amend any rule or regulation adopted by the Board of Directors.

Rules & regulations may be enforced by any method normally available to the owner of private property in Virginia including but not limited to application for injunctive relief or damages during which the court may award to the Association court cost and reasonable attorney's fees. *55-513 Title 55, Chapter 26 POAA of Virginia*

EDUCATION CORNER

REMEMBERING 9/11-10 years later

On September 11, 2007, visitors gathered for a sunrise ceremony at the Flight 93 National Memorial, marking the sixth anniversary.

An American Flag hangs on the Pentagon in preparation for the remembrance and wreath laying ceremony. Officer V. Hoopi while running into the Pentagon shouting "anybody here? Head towards my voice, come toward my voice," saved lives. His deep voice and strong Hawaiian accent became known as "the angel/the voice." Although three (3) people he rescued later died, at least twelve others credit him with their rescue.

November 14, 2008-A tattered, but intact American Flag was pulled from the rubble of Ground Zero and was donated to the National Law Enforcement Museum.

Shanksville, Pennsylvania-The famous words "let's roll" are emblazoned on the Flight 93 National Memorial.

The National Law Enforcement Officer Memorial was dedicated in 1991 in Washington, DC's historic Judiciary Square to honor America's fallen officers. The names of nearly 19,000-law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty are engraved on the memorial's marble walls and each year hundreds more are added.

IACF lost one of its members, Ms. A. Sherman. A Memorial Plate was installed at IACF's Memorial Site at Trapp Farm. Each year, flowers are placed at the site in her honor.

To inform you of what is taking place at your Campground during this Winter Season, and to prepare for the upcoming Summer Season the following applies:

- ✓ We have promoted Dennis Roberts to Acting Maintenance Supervisor. Steve Hawthorne is his assistant. Due to the installation of a bathroom in the Maintenance Building a couple of years ago, it disturbed the foundation, which caused water to run inside on the concrete floor. We have recruited the services of a consultant to explore our options to repair this problem.
- ✓ We are obtaining bids to repair the electric panel box in the Maintenance Building. Electric wiring does not meet code specifications. We are also replacing electric panel boxes in the utility rooms in some of our Comfort Stations.
- ✓ We have purchased a sand spreader for our tractor. This will allow us to spread sand when we have inclement weather. This has helped the workers keep our roads and parking lots cleaned during inclement weather.
- ✓ We have a serious problem in 17B Comfort Station. We are obtaining bids to renovate this station. We also are replacing facial boards and windowsills in many of the Comfort Stations. PO River plans to start turning the water on March 14th depending on the weather.
- ✓ We are obtaining proposals for new playground equipment. To avoid legal suits, we are getting recommendations from experienced playground vendors who are knowledgeable with the specifications, types of equipment acceptable in private/public playground and legal ramifications if injuries occur. Also, we want to make sure that this equipment, as well as the playground, is handicap accessible.
- ✓ One major issue is the furnace in the IACT Clubhouse. It is at least 38 years old and has been repaired numerous times thru the years. The furnace was serviced at the beginning of the Winter Season and has had several parts replaced. Recently, the furnace caught on fire. We are fortunate that no one was hurt and no damage was done to the building. The heating/cooling representative was present when the fire took place. I recently learned that the heating/cooling representative had advised the Maintenance Supervisor, that the furnace was considered condemned. However, that was advised three (3) years ago. At that time, the furnace was only patched for repairs and not replaced. All heating/cooling units are covered under a maintenance service agreement. We have four proposals for the replacement of a new unit. I will be presenting the proposals to the Board of Directors at its next meeting. We also have a problem with the Clubhouse foundation. The foundation has been compromised. The front of the building has to be dug up and resealed and new drain tile has to be installed. Minor repairs have been done over the years, but we are at the stage when minor repairs will not solve the problem. Bids will be solicited for the work.
- ✓ Gravel has been purchased to begin working on roads in various Glens. Weather permitting, we will be grading and graveling these roads prior to the beginning of the Summer Camping Season.
- ✓ Planning stages are taking place for our Annual Spring Open House being held on May 14th & 15th. Upcoming information will be announced.

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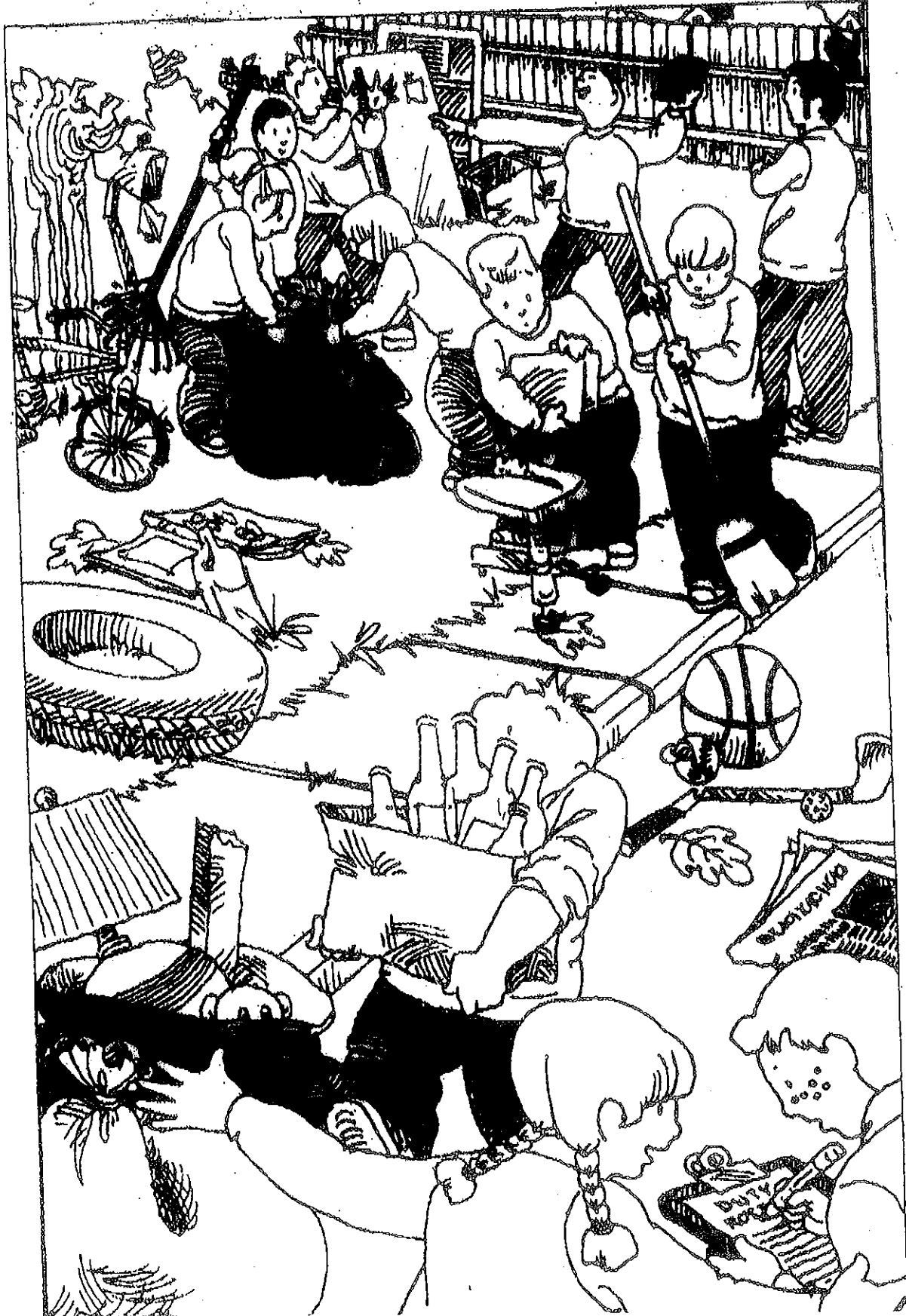
